Specific Objectives (II)

- ✓ To facilitate the modernization of public procurement systems in the region through the improvement of policy tools and processes in the areas of procurement control and transparency, MSMEs access and regional harmonization.
- ✓ To explore existing practices aimed at enhancing democratic governance through the interaction of ICTs and conventional mechanisms fostering involvement of potential suppliers, professional associations and non economic interest groups.
